#### Review of activities for the year

During the year under review the Fund reported a surplus of €603,086 while in 2011 it was €791,346, which resulted in a decrease of €188,260 as compared to the previous year.

The total contributions for the year amounted to €2,991,691 when compared with the previous year amounting to €2,527,355. As at 31 March 2012, total assets exceeded total liabilities by €3,211,928

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# **Special Report of the Auditors**

## To the Board Members of The Malta Community Chest Fund

We have examined the accompanying statements on pages 2 and 3, which comprise the statements of assets and liabilities as at 31 March 2012 and the statement of income and expenditure for the year then ended, together with the financial statements of The Malta Community Chest Fund (the "Fund") prepared in accordance with the Fund's statute for the year ended 31 March 2012.

We have carried out the procedures we considered necessary to confirm, by reference to the audited financial statements, that the accompanying statements have been properly prepared from those financial statements.

On the date shown below, we also reported, as auditors of the Fund, to the members on the financial statements prepared in accordance with the historical cost basis of preparation for the year ended 31 March 2012, and our audit report was as follows:

#### "Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of The Malta Community Chest Fund (the "Fund") as set out on pages 4 to 21, which comprise the statement of assets and liabilities as at 31 March 2012 and the statements of income and expenditure and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. This report, including the opinion, has been prepared for and only for the Board members as a body and may not be appropriate for any other purpose.

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on our judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, we consider internal control relevant to the Fund's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Fund's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting principles used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by Board members, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Fund as at 31 March 2012, and of its surplus and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the historical cost basis of preparation, except for investments classified at fair value through profit or loss which are measured at fair value".
